

BRITISH RULERS' 3RD SON TO WED

Announcement of Betrothal Leaves Wales Alone Heart-Whole.

BALMORAL, Scotland, Aug. 29.—King George and Queen Mary, with unexpected suddenness and on the heels of the Queen Astrid tragedy, announced today the betrothal of their next to the last bachelor son, the Duke of Gloucester, to Lady Alice Christabel Montagu-Douglas-Scott.

The tall 25-year-old Gloucester is the third son of the family and when he weds only the Prince of Wales of the four sons will remain a bachelor.

Lady Alice is a member of one of England's oldest families. She is 25, of fair complexion, a sports woman and an artist.

The announcement came just a day after the Duke of Kent to Princess Marina of Greece. Although Wales is now in his fourth year there has been no hint that he has found a mate.

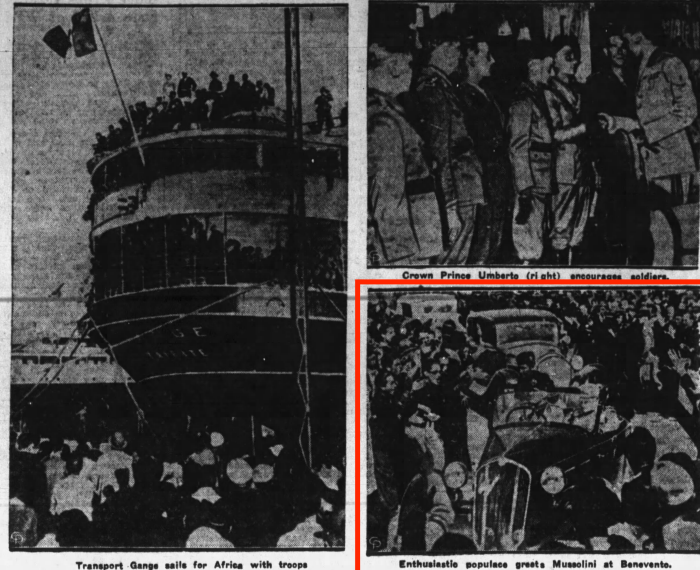

Hospital Projects Need Approval of President

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29.—The federal board of hospitalization today recommended to President Roosevelt for his approval veterans' administration hospital projects totalling approximately \$4,153,000.

Funds for the work will come from the \$11,250,000 allotted in the second deficiency bill for hospital construction by the veterans' administration.

SUGARCANE CROP 'FAIR PRICE' FIXED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29.—The farm administration announced today it had fixed a tentative "fair price" to be paid cooperating Louisiana sugar cane growers for their 1935 crop, which provided a payment in the price basis at which sugarcane was bought by processors under their 1933 contracts.

The tentative determination, officials said, processors would buy sugarcane from growers on the same basis as in 1933. Although standard cases varied in 1933, officials said that in making the 1935 benefit payments, standard cases would be defined and uniform conversion rates would be applied in Louisiana.

STRATOSPHERE HOP Decision Made For October Flight

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29.—Undaunted by two previous mishaps, the National Geographic society and army air corps today announced a decision to make a third effort at stratosphere exploration in October.

The huge balloon, the rip panel of which gave way before the takeoff on the first attempt this year, July 12, is being rebuilt and will be shipped to the takeoff point near Rapid City, S. D., in September.

Supreme Court Verdicts Cited by Cotton Chief
