Arab-Israeli clash snags nuclear treaty adoption

UNITED NATIONS (AP) – Ne-gotiators were poised to make the Non-Proliferation Treaty a per-manent part of global law Wednesday, but they missed a de-tail, one of the oldest around – the argument between Arabs and Israelis.

After all-night bargaing, a glo-bal conference had a compromise package ready to go Wednesday for extending the 25-year-old nu-clear pact indefinitely. Then 14 Arab countries produced a sur-prise resolution on Israel, and the decision was postponed until today.
