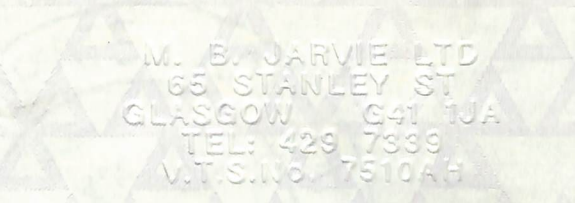

Why we have an MOT test

We have an MOT test to improve road safety and the environment by examining the main road safety and environmental features on the vehicle once a year. You are committing an offence if you use a vehicle which needs to have an MOT certificate and does not have a current or genuine certificate.

This certificate confirms that the vehicle described over the page was examined according to section 45 of the Road Traffic Act 1988 and met the standards required by law. However, this certificate only confirms that the vehicle met the minimum acceptable standards at the time it was tested. It does not confirm that the vehicle will continue to remain roadworthy for the next year. It is your responsibility to keep your vehicle roadworthy. Please remember that the test does not cover the condition of the engine, clutch or gearbox.

The condition of your vehicle

If within 28 days of the test, (3 months for rust- or corrosion- related problems) you consider the condition of the vehicle did not justify the issue of this certificate, you can contact any Vehicle Inspectorate office and ask for details on how to appeal. You can get the address and phone number for your local office at any MOT Test Station and in the phone book under 'Transport, Department of - Vehicle Inspectorate'. Do not have your vehicle repaired before any appeal test is carried out. Any change in the condition of the vehicle may affect the outcome of the appeal.

Crime prevention - If you think this certificate may be stolen or forged, please ring the Vehicle Inspectorate **MOT Enquiry Line** number on **0845 600 5977**. Calls are charged at the local rate.

Keep this certificate in a safe place and make a separate note of the details in case it is lost.

Expiry date

This is normally 12 calendar months from the date of issue. If you get a new certificate not more than one month before the old certificate expires, the expiry date on the new certificate can be entered as 12 months from the expiry date on the old certificate. To take advantage of this extension to the expiry date, you must show your current certificate to the tester before he or she issues the new one. Once issued the new certificate can only be replaced before it runs out, as long as you produce this and the last certificate to the vehicle testing station that tested the vehicle. If that testing station has closed, you can take both certificates to a Vehicle Inspectorate Local Office.

If you lose your certificate, you can usually get a duplicate copy of the original certificate from the testing station which carried out the test. You will need to give the certificate serial number or the approximate issue date and the registration number. If the testing station is now closed, you can get a duplicate copy of the original certificate from your local Vehicle Inspectorate office. You will have to pay a fee for this service.

Remember

If your vehicle has more than 8 passenger seats and has had a seat belt installation check, you **must** present this certificate at the vehicle's next MOT test even if it has expired. If you fit any more seat belts you will need to have another installation check.
