BEST OF SHOW at June's Spaltalia Italian car show went to Gennaro Lo Presto's 1931 Isotta Fraschini 8 ASS Torpedo Sport, above. Its elegant bodywork, by famed Milanese coachbuilder Carrozzeria Castagna, dazzled judges and crowds alike. The new owners of Carrozzeria Castagna were due to be at the event but didn't turn up, though an estimated 6000 people did visit the Belgian Spa.

Chase has owned the Montreal for 15 years after swapping it for an Aston Martin V8 and says it's never missed a beat.

Indeed, the range of classics on display delighted anyone who went along. Other stand-out cars included Andy Jones' original low-mileage 1968 Ford Zephyr MkIV V6, Martin Houston's immaculate 1989 Lotus Excel SE and Jack Cleydon's Gilman Imp, which is off shortly on an epic 10,000-mile journey to complete

Porsche's new museum welcomed its 250,000th visitor – Shoya Tachikawa from Tokyo – in June, only five months after opening.
