'Mother was warned of risk to girl'

HOSPITAL COMMITTEE REPLIES TO CORONER'S COMMENTS

Criticism by the Norwich coroner, Mr. Oliver Prior, that a mother was not told what was happening to her daughter at a hospital was answered today by a special committee of the Norwich, Lowestoft and Yarmouth Hospitals Committee.

At the inquest, Mrs. Alice May Kettle said she was not told that her 20-year-old daughter had had an operation for the removal of teeth until five hours afterwards. The girl died before she could get to the hospital to see her.

The coroner said: "I feel that from the view purely of public relations and ordinary humanity someone should have made sure that this mother, a humble person possibly but still a mother, should have been told what was happening to her daughter."

The ward sister explained to the mother when the girl was admitted that owing to her heart condition there was a risk entailed in having a dental extraction, the letter adds.

The mother signed the usual form agreeing to the operation.

"There was no question of not keeping in touch with the patient's mother. The question of whether she was, as reported in the Press, 'a humble person' caused no difference to the care which is always taken by the hospital to study the feelings of patients and their relatives."

Footnote.—A verdict of death from natural causes was recorded on the girl.

Prison officers to put in claim for pay rise

Britain's 4250 prison officers are to demand more pay. Their union leaders have told the Prison Commissioners that they will be putting in a new wage claim within a few weeks.

No figure has been named, but a spokesman of the Prison Officers' Association said today: "We want more than the five per cent pay increase

awarded recently to civil servants."

More than 250 women prison officers will be included in the claim.

Manpower losses

Higher pay is needed to attract more recruits to the prison service, say union officials.

They are worried about the fall in manpower. In June,

manpower wastage exceeded the intake.

The association wants to maintain the relativity between their pay and that of the police, who have recently submitted a demand for a 28 per cent wage increase for most ranks.

Last October, the prison officers received a pay increase of 15s. a week, with appropriate rises for women.
