## State Primaries Confusing

A "white backlash" against the Negro civil rights drive showed up strongly in the election of the 11 primary elections Tuesday but failed to materialize in another racial vote where racial vote was not expected. Baltimore contractor George P. Mahoney, longtime unsuccessful officeholder who campaigned on a pledge to veto any open housing bill, won a surprise victory in Maryland's Democratic gubernatorial race. In the runoff election, Mahoney, a staunch civil rights advocate, captured the Democratic senatorial nomination in Massachusetts from Boston Mayor John F. Collins, who autographed "backlash" support. Georgia won the first state-wide vote last since 1964 when it backed GOP presidential candidate Barry M. Goldwater in a civil rights backlash. Former Gov. Ellis Arnall, a moderate, was favored among a six-man field by the Democratic gubernatorial nomination.

# Late Rally In Top Stocks Helps Mark Substantial Boost

NEW YORK (UPI) — The stock market went from blue to blue chip Wednesday as a late rally in the better quality blue chip stocks helped substantially.

The blue chip shares were the best performers in the list, even during an early slump which saw many of the high flying glamour stocks down more than a point. The group improved gradually during the afternoon, then shot higher in the final hour.

The rise sent the Dow Jones industrial average soaring 19.75 to 8623-1/2, its best level since it stood at 8187-1/2 on Aug. 15. The gain on the day put the indicator up 21.33 since President Johnson proposed suspension of investment tax credit and accelerated depreciation rules last Thursday.

The United Press International Market Indicator went from a deficit to a gain of 8.28 per cent. Of the 1,482 issues traded, 461 advanced, 4 to new 1965 highs while 967 declined, 35 to new lows.

The New York Stock Exchange index posted a gain equal to 41 cents in the average share price.

Trading slowed to 6,538,000 shares from 82,900 shares Tuesday. Turnover was slow in the early part of the session but picked up during the rally.

The market's early performance was in line with the view of a hiking and filling pattern which usually precedes a test of its lows. The same pattern has followed rallies in the last few months.

Some analysts expect the market will test its lows but the general feeling is that that test may be delayed awhile. The outlook of many analysts is still optimistic but cautious.

Some observers said the blue chip stocks may be pulling out of their recent slump and heading for a boom period.

Among the encouraging factors in the news, according to analysts, are indications the proposed suspension of business investment incentives may be liberalized. At the House Ways and Means Committee hearing on the proposals several

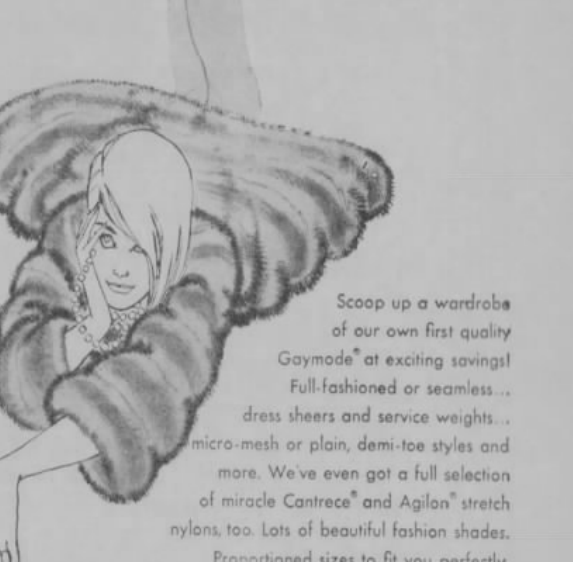
