

McAfee Easy Winner in Car Feature

ELKHART LAKE, Wis. (AP)—Jack McAfee of Sherman Oaks, Calif., ahead of the field by at least 10 lengths after the first two laps, piloted his Porsche to an easy victory in the featured 100-mile sports car race at Road America before 15,000 fans Saturday.

The silver German-built auto averaged 77.4 mph over the tricky four-mile course. Ed Crawford of Northfield, Ill., also in a Porsche, was second and Ed Lunken of Cincinnati, Ohio, driving a Ferrari, was third. Seventeen cars were entered in the race.

The opening race was the most dramatic event of the day as Carl Haas, Lincolnwood, Ill., and Bob Ballenger, Highland Park, Ill., both driving Porsches, tangled in a two-man duel. Haas, the winner, led virtually all the way but seldom by more than a car length. His average speed was 66.3 mph. Thirty autos were entered.

The second race was another runaway as Chuck Wallace of Chevy Chase, Md., pushed his Mercedes Benz 300-SL to an easy victory in an average speed of 72.4 mph. An expected duel between Wallace and Paul O'Shea of Rye, N. Y., failed to materialize when O'Shea's Mercedes was forced out of the race on the fourth lap because of oil trouble. The race was for 45 minutes.
