WHAT A SPORTS-CAR!—Hauthorn's 4.1litre Ferrari which won the Silverstone Production Sports-Car Race with consummate ease, at an average speed of 88½ m.p.h.

AFTER YOU, SIR !-Ken Downing waves on Peter Collins during the Production Sports-Car Race. Both are driving 2.9-litre Aston-Martins. Collins finished fourth, Downing 22nd. Perhaps the latter's numberplate slowed him up.

FINE DRIVE.—Tom Cole, fresh from finishing in fourth place in the great Mille Miglia, coming up in fine style in the 4.1-litre Ferrari "America" to take second position behind Hawthorn in the Sports-Car Race at Silverstone. He made fastest lap, at 90.84 m.p.h. Tom apparently prefers a rather worn Pirelli to new tyres of other makes !

POPULAR BRITISH DRIVER, Keg Parnell made no mistakes at Silverstone, bringing the 2.9-litre DB3 Aston-Martin home first in its class and third in general category in the Sports-Car Race. He averaged 87.34 m.p.h., beating all the Type C Jaguars and the Allards.
