# Over 60 Cars Expected For Courtland Races

Over 60 cars are expected to be on the starting grids this Saturday and Sunday at the Courtland Sports Car Races.

As of Tuesday, 44 drivers had indicated they would be at Courtland Air Base, 20 miles west of Decatur, for the sixth annual running of the Fourth of July weekend races sponsored by the Alabama Region of the Sports Car Club of America, and the Moulton Jaycees. Decatur's Crescent Motel is headquarters away from the track.
