Walt Hansgen made a lasting impression on his future "boss" in winning the Vandegrift Trophy race at Cumberland Sunday.

The Jaguar North American distributors have announced that Hansgen will join the Briggs Cunningham Jaguar Racing Team next month, making his debut in a Cunningham D-Jag at Elkhart Lake, Wis., June 23-24.

Hansgen piloted a D owned by Hansen-MacPhee Jaguar Sales of Bedford, Mass., Sunday and distanced all four of the Cunningham Jags. One was driven by defending champion Sherwood Johnston and the others by John Fitch, John Gordon Benett and Briggs himself.

At his F. K. Hansgen & Sons auto metal shop in Westfield, N. J., Walt is trying to get Duncan Buck's Ferrari, which was smashed up in Nassau, back in running condition for the Elkhart race.

Walt was originally approached by General Motors to drive a factory Corvette in all the national races this season as a "test pilot." At the time, his wife was ill and he was unable to make the Pebble Beach, Calif., event and had to turn down the offer. GM sent D. C.'s Dr. Dick Thompson to Pebble Beach with the Corvette originally intended for Hansgen.

Jack McAfee, who was the sensation of the Cumberland races in John Edgar's Porsche 550 Spyder, will switch back to racing Edgar's Ferrari 3.5 in the next national event at Ft. Worth, Tex., June 1-3. He would have driven the Ferrari at Cumberland but it swallowed a valve and shattered a piston during a practice run Saturday.

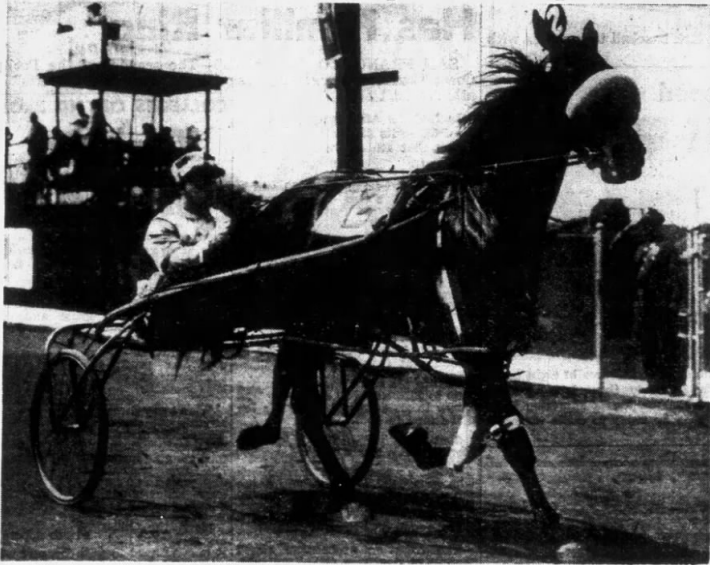
