Ferraris Run 1-2-3 In Flaming Finish

(AP) SEBRING Parkes of England and Umberto Maglioli of Italy, working together for the first time, drove a powerful new Ferrari to record course victory Saturday night in an injury-riddled 12hour Sebring Grand Prix road race.

Parks flashed across the finish line well ahead of the Italian team of Ludovico Scarfiotti and Nino Vaccarella, both of Milan.

It was the sixth time in seven years that a Ferrari has won the U.S. road racing classic and it was by far the most impressive victory. It marked the first time in the event's 14-year history that the Italian-made Ferraris swept all three top places.

Parkes, a 32-year-old London bachelor who works as an automotive engineer when not racing, not only set a speed record for Sebring but completed the most miles ever for a winner here.

Parkes and Maglioli, who es-

With Johnson at the controls and running fourth, the racer collided with an Alfa Romeo driven by Consalvo Sanesi of Italy. The cars burst into flames. One careened into a pit wall, spreading flames as it went.

Earlier, two other drivers were hospitalized when their racers overturned on the sharp hairpin turns that mark the 5.2 mile course at the old World War II air base.

It's Post-Time Turnstile Countdown

Many baseball magnates spend 11 months of the year explaining that weather is the chief commodity needed for successful spring training, which is such a coatty venture that exhibition game receipts are trivial. But in March they keep an eye on the turnstiles, hoping for the best.

John McHale and the Milwaukee Braves' brass are so well pleased with what they regard as the best training facility in the nation that they aren't even thinking of complaining, but it is true that the turnstiles at Municipal Stadium haven't been spinning quite as freely as had been hoped. The turnstile countdown is counting down.

For six games to date the Braves have lured 12,617, not too good considering that the Dodgers and Yankees were two of the attractions. The only excuses appear to be minor rain threats on a couple of days, and the fact the six games came on connecutive days, so that baseball fans with limited recreation money became selective in their games.

One year ago the first six games here pulled 15,719, but this included the attraction of the inauguration of the Stadium, two games with the Dodgers and one with the Yanks, plus the fact that three of the first six were week-end dates, as compared with only one so far this year.

So the comparative figures are not as bad under analysis. Today's game with the Dodgers, last Sunday game of the spring and last appearance of the Dodgers, should boost the total, and if the first night game on Monday gainst Detroit draws as expected, the eight-game totals might go ahead of last spring's first eight.

first eight. Weather can be a big whether, but there is a good chance that the 14-game totals this spring will be close to last spring's I7-game count of 31,613, perhaps with a better per game average. The ideal exhibition schedule for fans and for furnatile count would be to play only the Yanks and Dodgers, only on week-ends. Other clubs like Detroit and Pittsburgh, here this week, have localized followings, but no club has the magnetism of the two teams which played the 1963 World Se-ries. Most frequent complaint of fans is that there should be the played the 1963 World Se-tris no assurance of seeing baseball stars in an exhibition. The Yankees brought their big-name herees here and played them part of the game, betwee some other clubs. Kansas City, which doesn't have many headiners, didn't even bother to bring along such as Rocky Colavito, Jim Gentile, Manny Jiminez or Jose Tartaball.

Bobby Bragan plays good lineups in local games, takes a look at some of his promising youngsters on road trips, and basically this is what a lot of other managers are doing, and this gives rise to spectator criticism. But it is part of what spring training is for, and the pattern isn't likely to change.

It is also true that baseball isn't the only game in these parts. In a county with 32 golf courses, miles and miles of water for boating and fishing, plus horse and dog racing and jai-aiai at night, you might say baseball has some competition. But the Milwukce Braves have wedged into the picture in a manner to indicate better days ahead, when the turnstiles will hold up to the level of the rest of the staduim as the best in the busi-ness.
