DESPITE LAST-MINUTE interference by Colorado Governor Edwin C. Johnson and a sudden rash of ill-timed radio and newspaper publicity quoting Johnson's "call the race off" edict, the Colorado Region-SCCA national Buffalo Bill Mountain Climb ticked off like clock work this June.

This magnificent climb, enctioned by SCCA for the first time this year as a national event, offers one of the finest competitive mountain routes in the world. Five miles long and asphalt paved, it starts more than a mile above sea-level just outside scenic Golden, Colorado, west of Denver snapping upward 2,000 feet through 56 wicked curves including seven hairpin switchbacks. The finish line is at an altitude of more than 8,000 feet.

The first run up the rugged mountain was held in 1952 as strictly a local event. With wonderful community backing from Golden's Buffalo Bill Day's Association, the climb gained considerable stature in 1953 and 1954, finally receiving a justified national event status last December.
