14th Annual Rolling British Car Day Saturday, April 17, 2009

An incredibly great day, augmented by perfect weather was the setting for this year's 14th Annual Rolling British Car Day.

The cold statistics were that we had approximately 200 cars (158 were counted at 9:40, and they were still pouring in!), and 93 cars and their occupants enjoyed their picnics at beautiful San Dieguito Park.

We had a historic first for Rolling British Car Day, and an encouraging sign of "things to come!" A totally electric car, the Lotus Tesla was in attendance. Very beautiful, and VERY fast! No leaking oil, either!

I thought I would try to be the first one there, since I was theoretically "in charge". I arrived at 8:30, and there were probably already 25 cars in place including an incredible V-12 red Lagonda, and shortly thereafter, the spectacular 1931 Alvis Tourer, owned member John Kernan. Certainly two of the more incredible cars of the day.

I have to say that it was absolutely FANTASTIC to see the Farnsworths "new" Healey on display and being driven and enjoyed! What a beautiful, flawless car.

Another crowd pleaser was Jerry Craft's Mini "Rat Rod". It was parked almost next to John Kernan's Alvis. Quite the dichotomy. Jerry had e-mailed me during the week and asked if he thought it would "_____ people off if he brought it." My response was: "Absolutlely!!!!! Bring it!!!!" Perhaps no car was truly more in the spirit of British cars, and what folks can do with them—banger races and all!

Variety of cars? Gosh, I know I'll miss some, but besides the obvious and already mentioned, there were Aston Martins, Lotus, Sunbeam, (my favorite): Morris Minor Traveller and several other great "Moggies", 3 very nice Morgans (this year's Marque of the Year at British Car Day in recognition of their first 100 years under the same family ownership!!!!), DeLorean, Diamler, Land Rover and Jensen.

The route was about an hour and 15 minutes, and was "only" 31 miles, and most comments were that it was "just right". We drove through, in-and-around Rancho Santa Fe – seeing the many beautiful homes and properties. In spite of what some perceive as a rather "snobby" attitude in RSF, the opposite was largely true. As we paraded up-and-down mostly residential streets, we were greeted by folks coming





out of their homes and gardens and smiling, waving, cheering and some even taking photos. Maybe we shouldn't have honked, but what the hey? One person told Diane, as she was stopped "This is the most exciting thing that has happened around here in years!"

Of course, Rolling British Car Day has become synonymous with opportunities to "SMILE and WAVE" at each other as we pass each other on the roads. This year's route featured three different sections where we hit "roundabouts" and made some spiffy U-turns to accomplish this. The

The Alfa Romeo BAT is an Italian <u>concept car</u>. The car originated in a joint collaboration project between <u>Alfa</u> Romeo and the Italian design house; Bertone that began in 1953. Of the successful project came three cars: the BAT 5 in 1953, the BAT 7 in 1954, and finally the BAT 9 in 1955.

They were built upon the Alfa Romeo 1900 chassis. Each year between 1953 and 1955 at the Turin Auto show, Bertone and Alfa Romeo presented a BAT concept, the BAT 5, 7 and 9.

After more than 50 years, there is a new BAT model. The BAT 11 made its début in Geneva, at the time of the 2008 Geneva Auto Show, though not at the show itself. The new BAT 11, based on the Alfa Romeo 8C Competizione, shares many styling cues with the classic BAT cars of the 50s.

British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSD one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.
